

As a Delta Gamma (DG), you are an important part of my family's story, and may have never even known it. At the age of one, <u>my daughter, Laura, suddenly</u> <u>stopped tracking movements with her eyes</u> after experiencing seizures.

I knew pretty quickly that her vision had changed, but her doctors didn't agree. There was nothing wrong with the structure of her eyes, they said. Anatomically, everything was as it should be. My instincts as a mother told me otherwise and, fortunately, I knew exactly who to turn to for help.

As a DG alumna from Washington University in St. Louis, I had learned about Anchor Center for Blind Children, one of the five schools founded by the women of Delta Gamma Fraternity. As part of DG's philanthropy, *Service for Sight*, I even ran trainings about visual impairments and hosted them at Anchor Center before Laura was born.

When I felt that my concerns about Laura's vision weren't being addressed, I scheduled an eye exam and assessment at Anchor Center, with their team of experts. She was promptly diagnosed with Cortical Visual Impairment (CVI) – a prevalent (but often overlooked) neurologically-based, visual processing disorder – and began receiving services.

When we first received her diagnosis, it felt like we were flailing around in the dark. We worried for her. Would she be okay? Would she feel isolated her whole life? Would she make friends?

<u>Thanks to the support of generous donors, many of them Delta Gammas, we</u> <u>saw her world open up at Anchor Center.</u> She began to flourish and interact with her peers. Now, she seeks them out, wanting to sit close with her classmates, smiling at them, and joining in on group activities.

Laura will be attending public kindergarten next year - and the support of Delta Gammas helped prepare her to thrive through this transition. **Will you continue to "Do Good" and help other children with visual impairments and their families find a light in the dark?**



DELTA GAMMA & ANCHOR CENTER

Anchor Center for Blind Children was founded in 1982 by the local Delta Gamma alumnae chapter and a librarian from the Colorado Library for the Blind.

The DG alumnae chapter sought to further their philanthropic commitment towards Service for Sight by opening an entire center in Denver, CO dedicated to children, age birth through five, with visual impairments.

The first class included four preschool students and six homebound infants. Now, with the continued support of Delta Gammas, Anchor serves nearly 300 children and family members each year.

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Without the continued dedication of Delta Gammas, we would never have learned about how best to support Laura at home, including the things that will help her after she graduates this spring. <u>Anchor Center taught us how to help her communicate, through assistive devices, and how to give her the confidence to be as independent as possible.</u>

One of my favorite Anchor moments is watching Laura during circle time in the morning. Her teachers give her a device to use during the welcome song. She hits a button, over and over, that says, "I'm here!" – and you gave Laura a voice that I love hearing her use.

As a DG, I have used my voice to support those with visual impairments since college. I know more than most about visual impairments and services – but even *I* didn't understand how important Anchor Center was until Laura started.

Anchor Center is not just about vision. It's about everything!

There is an incredible team under one roof here, including Pediatric Ophthalmologists, Teachers of Students with Visual Impairments, Early Childhood Special Educators, Physical Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech and Language Pathologists, Horticultural Therapists, Music Therapists, and more. *They work together for the whole of the child and that is so rare, so unique.*

Anchor Center is also about the support we receive as a family...the hope we feel, the comfort we're given, the connections we make. If I had to describe Anchor Center in one word, it would be "home."

Thank you for supporting *the home that*:

- *welcomed me back through its doors with open arms*, this time as a concerned, first-time mother;
- *surrounded Laura with love*, helping us to see life differently and a bright future for our daughter;
